

STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT



Introduction

The Student Code of Conduct is intended to provide a set of general principles to guide students in their interaction with staff, students, parents and the wider College community. Codes of Conduct provide a framework on which to build a secure, happy and orderly environment for the enjoyment and benefit of each student.

All members of the College community are encouraged to accept responsibility for their own actions, consider their behaviour towards others, and respect authority. The College community's expectations about standards of behaviour are drawn from the ethos on which the College is founded.

Choose to Learn

Be Kind

Jesus displayed sacrificial love. We are called to love others as ourselves.

Do my actions reveal that I have an awareness of others and desire to show them empathy, compassion respect and grace?

Take Responsibility

God desires all creation to be redeemed and reconciled.

Do my actions reveal a respectful attitude toward myself, students, staff, property and God's creation?
Do I challenge injustice and seek to improve the world?

In the classroom I will:

Seek help when needed.
